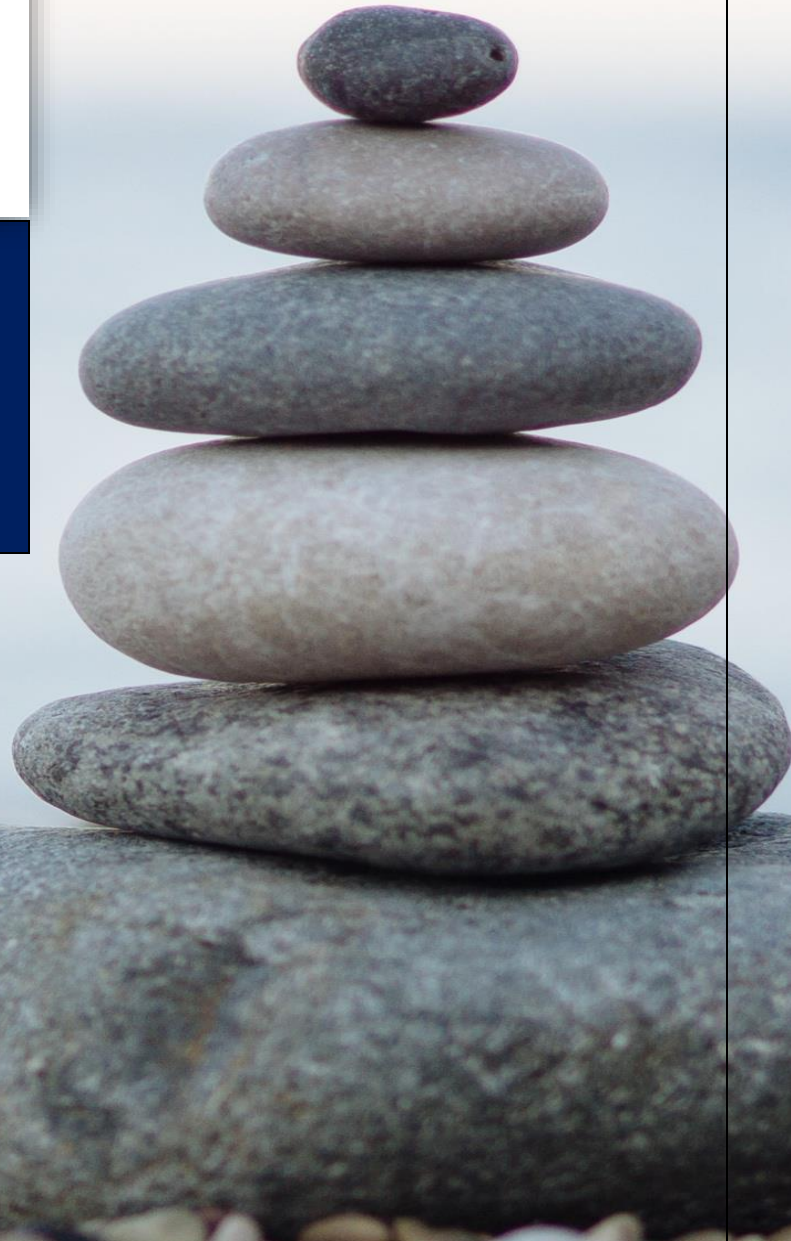

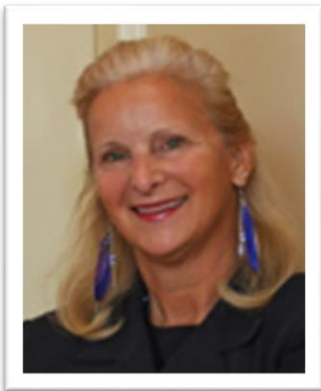

Speaker Bios



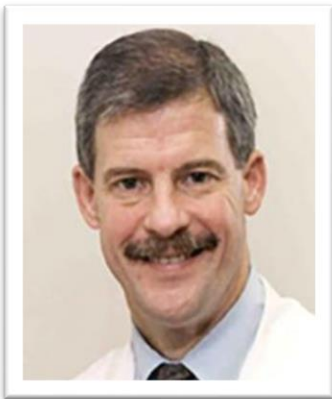
Mark Sanders, LCSW, CADC

Mark is an international speaker in the addictions field whose presentations have reached thousands throughout the United States, Europe, Canada, Caribbean and British Islands. He is the author of five books on recovery and curator of the Online Museum of African American Addictions Recovery. He has also had two stories published in the New York Times Best Selling Book Series, *Chicken Soup for The Soul*. Sanders is the recipient of numerous awards, including the Barbara Bacon Award for outstanding contributions to the social work profession as a Loyola University of Chicago alumni, Health Care Alternative Systems Leadership Award, and the Professional of the Year Award from the Illinois Addiction Counselor Certification Board. He is past board president of the Illinois Association of Addictions Professionals and co-founder of Serenity Academy Chicago, the only recovery high school in Illinois.



Cynthia Moreno Tuohy, BSW, NCAC II, CDC III, SAP *Executive Director, NAADAC, the Association for Addiction Professionals*

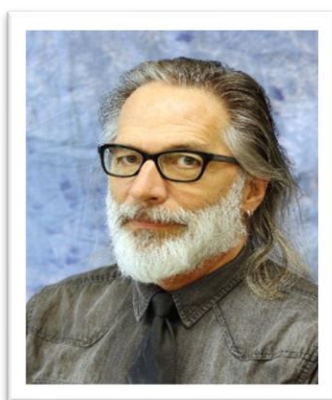
Cynthia Moreno Tuohy, BSW, NCAC II, CDC III, SAP, is the Executive Director of NAADAC, the Association of Addiction Professionals. She previously served as the Executive Director of Danya Institute and the Central East Addiction Technology Transfer Center. Prior to that, she was the Program Director for Volunteers of America Western Washington serving as the administrator of alcohol/drug centers providing a broad range of services, and a trainer in Domestic Violence/Anger Management and Conflict Resolution. Moreno Tuohy has written on a variety of professional issues, including addiction evaluation, counseling methods, co-occurring disorders, treatment, and recovery. She has served as President of NAADAC, Certification Board Commissioner, International Chair, Treasurer, and Legislative Chair for NAADAC.



Dr. Ted Parran, MD

Dr. Ted Parran established the Addiction Fellowship Program at CWRU School of Medicine in 1994, teaches on the Addiction Psychiatry Fellowship faculty at University Hospitals and co-directs the current Addiction Medicine Fellowship Program at St. Vincent Charity Medical Center. He is a graduate from Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine. At the Baltimore City Hospital of Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine Dr.

Parran was selected to be the Medical Chief Resident and in 1987 he received the Outstanding Faculty Teacher Award from the Department of Medicine. In 1988 he returned to Cleveland and CWRU School of Medicine. Dr. Parran is board certified in Internal Medicine and Addiction Medicine, and his group practice provides medical directorship services to several Substance Abuse treatment programs in northeast Ohio. He is widely published and has been an invited speaker at national and international conferences for the past three decades.



Michael Kemp, NCAC I, ICS, CSAC, CSW

Michael worked in the addiction treatment profession for 36+ years. Has provided clinical supervision to addiction programs & counselors in all levels of care for 20+ years. Has been an adjunct faculty in the Fox Valley Technical College Addiction Studies Program for 16+ years. He has served on various Addiction Treatment/ Service boards in Wisconsin since 1998. Has been the co-chair of NAADAC's (The Association for Addiction

Professionals) Public Policy Committee for the past 8 years: has served on the committee since 2006. Michael is a commissioner, & Secretary/Treasurer on National Certification Commission for Addiction Professionals (NCC AP).



Thomas D. Stuber, LPCC-S, LICDC-CS

Thomas is President and Chief Legislative Officer of The LCADA Way and an Adjunct Professor of Addiction Counseling at LCCC and Ashland University. Prior to his current role, he was the President and CEO of LCADA Way for 21 years. Thomas took the Agency to a higher level of customer service to ensure our customers don't feel like they are "less than" just because they suffer with the disease of addiction. The LCADA Way currently provides treatment services in Lorain, Erie, Medina and Cuyahoga counties. He also currently serves as President, OARP (Ohio Alliance of Recovery Providers). He sits on the Advisory Boards of Lorain County Recovery Court and Lorain County Veterans Court. Tom was also one of the original members of the Cleveland Treatment Directors Association, The Cleveland Treatment Directors Association developed the Clinical Protocols now used by the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM Criteria).



Martina Moore, Ph.D, LPCC, LICDC-CS

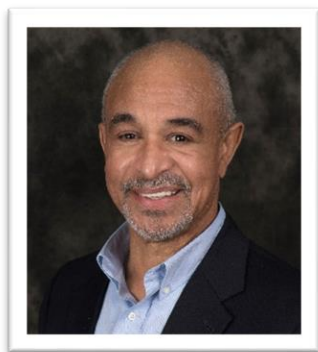
Dr. Martina S. Moore is a business owner, counselor, international speaker, trainer, and professor, just to name a few. Dr. Moore established Moore Counseling & Mediation Services, Inc. (MCMS) over 20 years ago. MCMS is an outpatient dual diagnosis center that provides counseling and training services. Dr. Moore and the Cleveland Judge Marilyn B. Cassidy developed the first human trafficking court docket. Her agency is the treatment provider for over seven specialized dockets in the City of Cleveland. Dr. Moore is also a professor at John Carroll University. In her role at John Carroll University, she developed and is also the Coordinator of the Substance Use Disorder Concentration. She is also an instructor at the Gestalt Institute of Cleveland. Dr. Martina Moore is currently the Ethics Chair Liaison for the Ohio Counseling Association (OCA) and is past President she has been active for over 20 years. She is the immediate President of the Ohio Substance Use Disorders Professionals (OSUDP) and the current President-Elect of International Association of Marriage and Family Counselors (IAMFC). She is also the past President of the Association of Humanistic Counselors (AHC).



Orville Dean, MA, LICDC-CS

Orville has been a counselor, trainer and author in the field of substance abuse for forty years. He currently works for The LCADA Way and provides services for inmates in jail. This session will offer a new to look at Prochaska's 12 Principles of Change. Substance abuse services often provide activities that work well with clients in the Action stage of change. However, many clients not in the Action stage simply drop out. This

interactive presentation will provide instruments to evaluate the client's current stage of change, and then provide exercises and activities to use with clients in the first three stages of change. Clinicians will receive information and handouts they can use with clients who are not ready for Action-oriented treatment services. After this session, attendees will be able to evaluate their client's readiness for change and use new techniques to motivate clients who are not yet ready.



Jim Joyner, LICDC-CS

Jim is a Licensed Independent Chemical Dependency Counselor-Clinical Supervisor. He has been working professionally in the field of substance use disorder/addiction treatment, prevention, intervention and training services for over fifty years. In 2016, Jim was selected as Professional of the Year by NAADAC. Jim is in long term recovery from substance use disorder and has been alcohol and other drug free for over 40 years. Currently semi-

retired he facilitates 3 weekly online virtual Family Education and Support Group Program meetings family members who are concerned about a loved one's alcohol or other drug use. Jim believes that the single greatest negative impact on the quality of life that effects every man, woman and child in America can be found in the combined consequences related to the addictive use of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs and substances. He further believes through comprehensive education, prevention, treatment and educated policies that this problem can be significantly reduced. He continues to dedicate his career to that belief.
