Mark Sanders, LCSW, CADC

Mark is an international speaker in the addictions field whose presentations have reached thousands throughout the United States, Europe, Canada, Caribbean and British Islands. He is the author of five books on recovery and curator of the Online Museum of African American Addictions Recovery. He has also had two stories published in the New York Times Best Selling Book Series, *Chicken Soup for The Soul*. Sanders is the recipient of numerous awards, including the Barbara Bacon Award for outstanding contributions to the social work profession as a Loyola University of Chicago alumni, Health Care Alternative Systems Leadership Award, and the Professional of the Year Award from the Illinois Addiction Counselor Certification Board. He is past board president of the Illinois Association of Addictions Professionals and co-founder of Serenity Academy Chicago, the only recovery high school in Illinois.

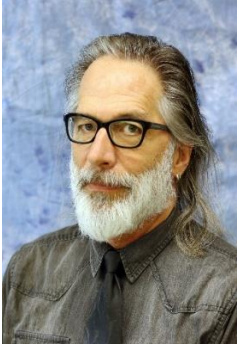
Gary Ferguson ND

Gary Ferguson (Aleut/Unangax) is a Qagan Tayagungin tribal member and licensed Naturopathic Doctor. He serves as Director of Outreach & Engagement, Institute for Research and Education to Advance Community Health (IREACH) at Washington State University. Dr. Ferguson has spent twenty years working across Alaska to address the social, economic, cultural and environmental factors that contribute to the health and well-being of Alaskans. His past positions include providing clinical services to his home region at Eastern Aleutian Tribes and serving as a Director at the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium and CEO of the Rural Alaska Community Action Program.



Dr. Ted Parran MD

Dr. Ted Parran established the Addiction Fellowship Program at CWRU School of Medicine in 1994, teaches on the Addiction Psychiatry Fellowship faculty at University Hospitals and co-directs the current Addiction Medicine Fellowship Program at St. Vincent Charity Medical Center. He is a graduate from Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine. At the Baltimore City Hospital of Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine Dr. Parran was selected to be the Medical Chief Resident and in 1987 he received the Outstanding Faculty Teacher Award from the Department of Medicine. In 1988 he returned to Cleveland and CWRU School of Medicine. Dr. Parran is board certified in Internal Medicine and Addiction Medicine, and his group practice provides medical directorship services to several Substance Abuse treatment programs in northeast Ohio. He is widely published and has been an invited speaker at national and international conferences for the past three decades.
